LIVE HENS

Prices on light hens held unchanged. Prices at 7-7½c generally included producer gathering and loading services and full condemnation deductions based on dressing plant grading reports. Demand fair. Offerings fully adequate, but not substantially increased despite lower terminal egg market prices. Demand on heavy hens fair. Offerings light. Prices paid at farm: Light Hens 6-7½, mostly 6½-7½; Heavy hens 14-15½, mostly 14-14½c.

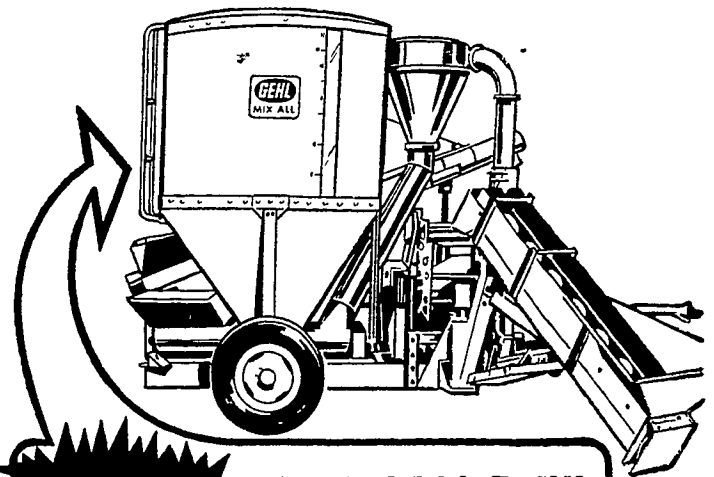
