A dentist, Stayer spent ten weeks in Nigelia last year, and is on his way back there this weekend for seven more weeks. He reported that a dentist is a rate sight in Nigelia and he felt the natives had appreciated his work.

He showed slides depicting the interior of Nigeria, and described the faiming practices observed there Stayer said that two acres of ground is sufficient to supply enough food for a Nigeriah family. They seem to thrive on corn meal mush mide from guinea coin, the dentist said Peanuts are raised, but primarily for export

The farm women also heard reports on the state convention which the society held at Harrisburg during the Farm Show
