The resolution committee consisting of Richard Maule, Theodore Beck and Chester Eby, presented the following resolutions which were adopted:

Lancaster Farming, Saturday, February 4, 1967—13

1. WHEREAS, There is a tendency on the part of some of the doctors and surgeons in Lancaster County to charge fees in excess of the rates covered by most health insurance plans And WHEREAS, We consider this practice to be both unfair and unethical. Be it RESOLVED, That Lancaster County Pomona Grange #71 go on record as opposing such practice and ask that said practice be discontinued.

2. WHEREAS, The dairy men of Lancaster County have enjoyed a better price for milk under Marketing Order #4 by meeting certain sanitary requirements and keeping production in line with utilization And WHEREAS, The U. S. Department of Agriculture's plan to change Marketing Order #4 to a market-wide pool

3. WHEREAS, There is now in the process of passing the General Assembly a proposal to call a convention to rewrite parts of the State Constitution WHEREAS, There is now ample provisions to amend the constitution by the amendment process Therefore we the members of Lancaster County Pomona Grange #71 go on record as opposed to calling a constitutional convention

would flood the market with surplus milk from New York causing a loss to Lancaster County dairymen of thousands of dollars. And WHEREAS, Said change would result in many farmers being forced to go out of the dairy business and seek a more lucrative enterprise. And WHEREAS, The consumer would not profit by the change but would be getting milk not produced under the strict sanitary requirements as enforced in the Philadelphia area Be it RESOLVED, That Lancaster County Pomona Grange #71 go on record as opposing the change of Marketing Order #4 to a market-wide pool
