Daniel Good, Columbia R1, bought the 22-pound champion hen at auction at the recent Pennsylvania Poultry Federa-

tion banquet at Harrisburg with his bid of \$10 a pound. (The 1967 Farm Show champion hen and tom were both entered by Harry Lamparter of Mountville, a perennial Farm Show turkey winner.)

After introducing all the guests, Good described how he got into the live poultry business 25 years ago. From 1938 to 1942, he said he had been farming and dressing chickens and turkeys for the local market.

"In 1942, we couldn't raise enough poultry for our needs, so I bought an old truck and

began buying and hauling chickens from other growers." Good began catering to the live market exclusively after 1945, and started selling to small dressing plants. Through trial and error, he soon discovered where the best markets were, and gradually be-

gan to supply larger buyers as well. Today, that old original truck has grown to a fleet of six, including a tractor trailer which hauls Leghorn fowl to Vineland, New Jersey. Good buys poultry from some broiler contractors and from many independent growers. "We are proud to say," he added, "that at least 90 percent of our poultry comes from within a 50-mile radius of Lancaster."

Good's is a family operation which includes his wife and two sons—Lester and Daniel, Jr. In 1966, the firm handled a record volume of 21 million birds.

Another highlight of the evening was an illustrated "80 Days Around The World" talk by Adams County Turkey Grower Fred Osborn.
