For best county steer at the Farm Show, Michael Hosler of Manheim P3 received the J. C. Snively trophy and a watch won the breed championship from New Holland Machine at the Farm Show. was presented with the Wolgemuth

Hosler's Hereford won the breed reserve championship at Harrisburg.

A \$25 U.S. Savings Bond was presented to Tom Houser for his competition at district, state, and national levels in 4-H conservation. The award was from the National 4-H Conservation Society.

Lamb club awards went to Fred Hess, Donald Miller, and Linda Ober.

Hess received trophies from the S. H. Hestand Co. and Miller and Bushong. His entries at the Farm Show won the grand championship and grand champion single lamb

Miller was presented with trophies from Wenger Feed Co. and Miller and Bushong. He had the reserve grand champion lamb at the Farm Show.

Miss Ober received the First National Bank of Elizabethtown trophy as the high project scorer in lambs. Her score, 96.9, was achieved in her first year of club work, Smith reported.

The county agent said 115 members completed baby beef projects, out of 134 who started, and 10 of 11 lamb project members completed theirs.
