Prices on light hens held unchanged, but trended lower within the range in instances Offerings adequate. Demand less aggressive and no more than fair. Some dressing plants experiencing lower selling prices for ready-to-cook, ice-packed, canned fowl. Trading activity on heavy hens was poorly defined due in part to very scarce local offerings. Some plants continue to supplement requirements with supplemental shipments from Del-Mar-Va. section. Prices paid at farm: Light Hens 6-7c; Heavy Hens, Too few sales to report prices.

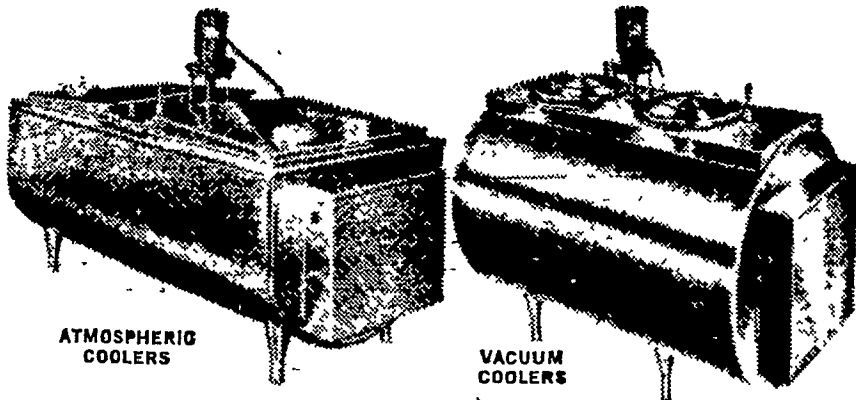

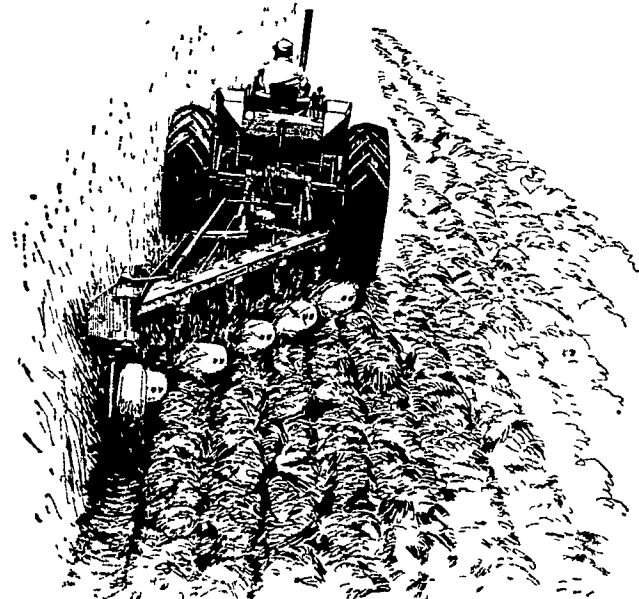
