Slaughter steers 50-75 lower, slaughter heifers 25-75 lower. Cows steady to 50 higher. Bulls steady in the carlot dressed beef trade, steer and heifer beef steady to 50 lower, decline on Choice, cow beef steady to 75 lower, decline on Canner and Culler.
