Chick Hatchery Costs Evaluated In Study

Obtaining greater efficiency in chick hatcheries is the object of a report recently published by the U.S. Department of Agriculture.

The fifth in a series about poultry hatcheries, the report analyzes management of 24 egg-type chick hatcheries in 10

commercial egg-producing states. Researchers reviewed records for these hatcheries, and checked costs against simulated costs of six model hatcheries.

Emphasis of the study was on hatchery sizes, "lowest cost" hatcheries, scheduled operations, length of operating

seasons, and the extent of capacity and labor usages.

SUMMARY

Wages and salaries in the 24 hatcheries average two-thirds of the total cost of producing each salable pullet — ranging from 59 to 77 percent depending on capacity and utilization, according to the report.

Total costs for hatchery operations ranged from slightly less than a dime to somewhat more than a quarter for each salable pullet. Comparable costs per salable pullet in the model hatcheries were lower, ranging from about a nickel to about 23 cents, the report notes.

Most of the commercial hatcheries during the study year of 1962 operated at less than 30 percent of their top capacity. Only nine plants operated all year. All hatcheries operated in March and April, the peak months of the February-May season. Nearly three-fourths of the hatcheries operated throughout this season.

Costs were calculated for the model hatcheries on the basis of 22- and 52-week operations at various levels of capacity. The results showed most savings were realized when about three million eggs were set per year. The range of model operating volumes studied was from one to 10 million eggs.
