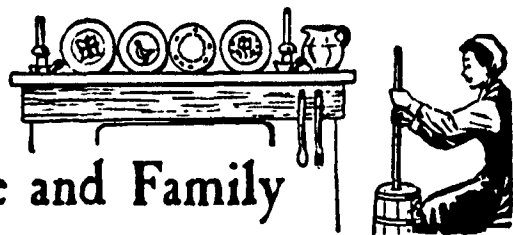
The group will be the guests of Society 13 at a luncheon meeting today at 1 p.m. at the Witmer Fire Hall.

Salmon — Nutritious, Economical Main Dish

Salmon salad with tomato wedges and hard-cooked eggs, topped with low-calorie French dressing is a lunch for weight-conscious people.



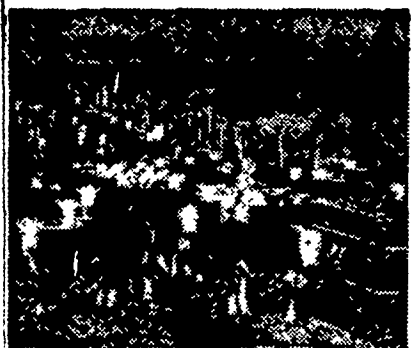
