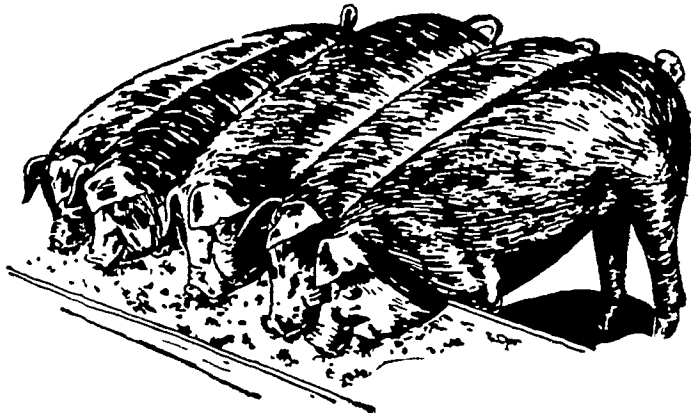

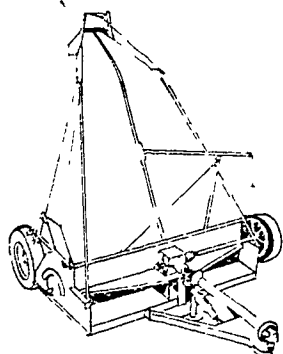

quality regulation which could effect them if their milk was shipped interstate.

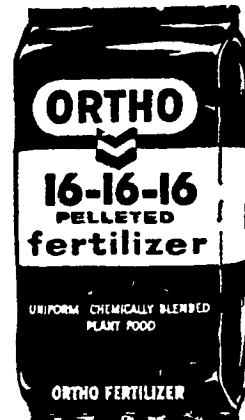
By July 1, 1967, any dairyman shipping milk with a white blood cell count in excess of two million per milli-

liter of milk will be in trouble, Guss said.

He noted, however, that high producing herds seldom have any trouble with this problem. He said that generally cows milking over 325 days and giving less than 20 pounds of milk are the prime sources of these excessively high counts.

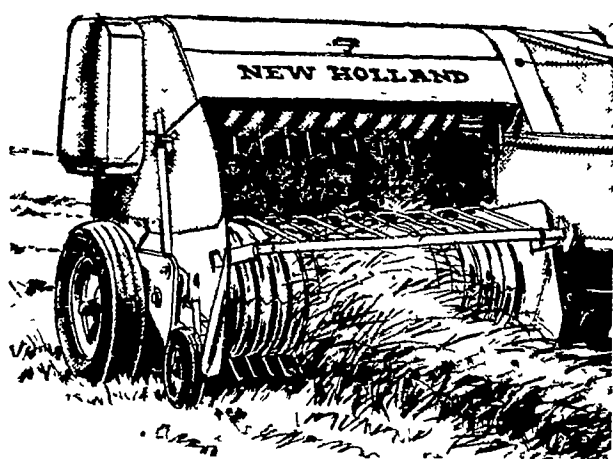
