- 2 tablespoons vinegar

MUSHROOMS IN SOUR CREAM

- 8 SLICES BACON, CUT UP
- 1/2 cup minced onion
- 1 pound fresh mushrooms, sliced
- 1 teaspoon flour
- 1 cup dairy sour cream
- 1 teaspoon Worcestershire sauce

In skillet fry bacon until crisp; drain on absorbent towel. Pour off all but 2 tablespoons of drippings. Add onion and mushrooms; saute 10 minutes over low heat. Stir in flour. Add sour cream and Worcestershire sauce. Cook over low heat, stirring constantly, until heated through. Spoon over toast. Sprinkle on bacon. 4-6 servings.
