NFU Honors Sen. McGovern

South Dakota Senator George S. McGovern was honored by the National Farmers Union Wednesday night for "Outstanding Service to Agriculture." Presenting the award and medallion at the closing banquet of the organization's 1967 annual convention, NFU president Tony T. Dechant described McGovern as the "Senate's foremost farm spokesman" and said, "There isn't a more staunch or more effective champion of family farm agriculture in America." Among McGovern's accomplishments listed as justifying the "heartfelt thanks of all farm people" were: — Authoring and guiding through to passage many key

sections of federal farm law, including the 1964 voluntary wheat bill, and income-boosting provisions in the Food and Agriculture Act of 1965. — Reversing Administration steps to depress farm prices because of a concern over inflation in 1966, when he won wide bipartisan co-sponsorship and unanimous Senate approval of his "parity resolution" opposing any action to prevent farm returns from rising to 100 percent of parity. — Prompting investigations exonerating farmers from the blame for rising food prices, and continuing in writing, speeches, and other ways to insist that consumers recognize their stake in a prosperous agriculture and fair farm prices. On the international front,

the citation recalled McGovern's service in making the Food for Peace Program a "vital force in the world," and noted that his original International Food and Nutrition Act "became the foundation for the expanded 'War Against Want' launched by Congress last year . . . A benchmark of George McGovern's public career in his conviction that American food abundance can be a powerful instrument of peaceful development abroad." "His courageous, articulate role in the development and guidance of American farm and food policies in the past decade has distinguished George McGovern as an outstanding farm statesman" the organization said.
