HARRISBURG - Approximately 250 million quarts of milk were produced in Pennsylvania in February, six million quarts less than in February 1966, the State Crop Reporting Service said this week.

It represented a decline of two percent from year ago levels, compared to declines of three percent in Ohio, four percent in New York, and six percent in New Jersey.

Total milk production in the nation was up one percent. mainly as the result of an eight percent increase in Wis-

Pennsylvania's trend was attributed in part to another drop of 2,000 in cow numbers during February. The estimated total, 752,000 cows, was 30,000 less than the number reported in February 1966.
