### Nationwide Milk Hearings Slated

The US Department of Agriculture announced it will hold regional public hearings the week of April 10 to review the nationwide level of fluid milk (Class I) prices paid dairy farmers under 70 federal milk marketing orders.

Consumer and Marketing Service officials said the hearings will consider the appropriate prices to farmers under all existing orders except the three in Florida. For those markets prices will be reviewed in a separate hearing soon.

The hearings with respect to fluid milk prices in federal order markets across the country are being held at the request of dairy farmer representatives, numerous dairy farmers, and some milk dealers. USDA said the farmers and their representatives said the review of prices paid to them by milk dealers is necessary because of increasing costs of milk production, labor shortages, and other economic factors.

The four meetings are scheduled for Denver, Colo. April 11, St. Louis, Mo., April 12, Cleveland, Ohio, April 13 and Washington, D.C., April 14.

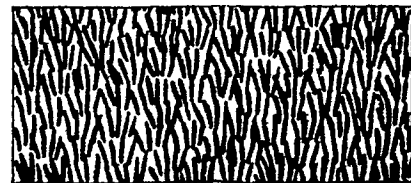
