CATTLE — Receipts 18,800 compared with 18,800 the previous week and 21,500 a year ago Twelve market receipts 154,000 compared with 155,000 last week and 165,500 a year ago Compared with last weeks close, slaughter steers sold steady to 50 higher with most advance on high choice and prime. Slaughter heifers were strong to mostly 25 higher and cows were 50-100 higher with cutter and utility at the full advance Bulls were fully steady. In the carlot dressed meat trade, steer beef was steady to mostly 50 higher, instances 1 00 higher on choice 800-900 lb carcasses, heifer beef was generally 1 00 higher and cow beef sold 50 higher
