

### Agr. Econ.-Sociology Major Offered At PSU

Professional training in agricultural economics and rural sociology is offered in a new four-year major in the College of Agriculture at Penn State University as announced recently.

Such a major prepares students for jobs in management or government where the objective is wise use of resources either in operating a business or in attaining various social objectives, states Dr. Jerome K. Pasto, associate director of Resident Education in the College.

Career opportunities exist in area and human resource development, zoning and planning commissions, management of resources such as

land, water, and wildlife, agricultural extension work, agricultural credit management, and foreign agricultural service.

Courses in economics, history, sociology, political science, and psychology make up a considerable portion of this major in agricultural economics and rural sociology.

To enroll in Penn State's major in agricultural economics and rural sociology, high school graduates must have a background of three units of English, two units of algebra or one of algebra and one of plane geometry, one unit of science, and nine additional units. Interested persons must also submit scores from the Scholastic Aptitude Test of the College Entrance Examination Board.

### Poultry Serviceman's Short Course June 6-8

The Pa. Poultry Industry Short Course will be presented by Penn State University from June 6-June 8. In previous years this course has been called the Poultry Sales and Service Short Course. This year the course will also be co-sponsored by the Pennsylvania Poultry Federation.

The program this year will include: psychology of selling; a review of the Pennsylvania vaccination program; the fatty liver problem; cages for layers—their operation and management; infectious coryza; challenges in the production of poultry biologics; epidemiology

of salmonellosis; laryngotracheitis; control of salmonellosis; disinfectants—their evaluation and use; an economic analysis of reproduction systems; merchandising pays; and brooding and rearing pullets on wire.

In addition to staff members of the College of Agriculture and Business Administration at Penn State; William Anderson, pathologist, Regional Diagnostic Laboratory, Doylestown; Lionel Barton, graduate student, Michigan State University; Kenneth Deitreich, agricultural representative for Kraft Foods; E. F. Galenczel, Director of Research, Delaware Poultry Laboratories, Inc., Millsboro, Delaware; Norman Hecht, Hecht Hatchery, Walden, New York;

E. T. Mallinson, poultry pathologist, Pa. Bureau of Animal Industry Laboratory; Stan Smith, poultry nutritionist, Agway, Inc.; J. E. Williams, research veterinarian, U.S.D.A. S. E. Poultry Research Laboratory; will present the program. Any individual 16 years of age or older is eligible to attend the course.

The fee for the course is \$10 for Pennsylvanians and \$15 for non-Pennsylvanians.


FULL STAIR STEP
