Marketwide Pool Bad Decision, Honan Charges
 "The U. S. Department of Agriculture's announced decision to impose a marketwide pool on Delaware Valley milk farmers is in flagrant disregard of the intent of milk farmers, handlers, and consumers in this area," charged Dr. James E. Honan, general manager of Inter-State Milk Producers' Cooperative.
 "It is counter to the weight of evidence: it is not supported by a single milk producing group in the market, and it is in complete defiance of the wishes not only of the milk farmers and handlers, but also of the expressed preferences and pleadings of the Governors of Pennsylvania and Delaware and of the delegations of the affected areas in Congress," Honan continued. "Rather than saving the farmers one million dollars annually as the Department states," Honan asserted, "this decision will result in 10 million dollars' loss to the farmers and to the area. In addition to the economic loss, the decision will produce serious contraction of the already inadequate milk supply. The Department's action, in short, is indefensible," Honan charged.
 About 4,500 farmers from Pennsylvania, New Jersey, Maryland, and Delaware now ship milk to the Philadelphia area. Inter-State Milk Producers' Cooperative reportedly represents 3,300 of these milk farmers. A delegation of more than 50 persons, including Senators and Congressmen or their aides and Inter-State Milk Producers' Cooperative directors, held a meeting in Washington in January to plan action urging the Department to retain and enforce the Handler Pool which has been in effect in the Philadelphia area for a quarter century.
 Inter-State Milk Producers' Cooperative has led a continuous fight against the change to a market pool since May 28, 1965, Honan stated.
