Compared with last weeks close, slaughter steers sold 25-75 lower with most decline on High Choice and Prime and slaughter heifers were 25-50 lower. 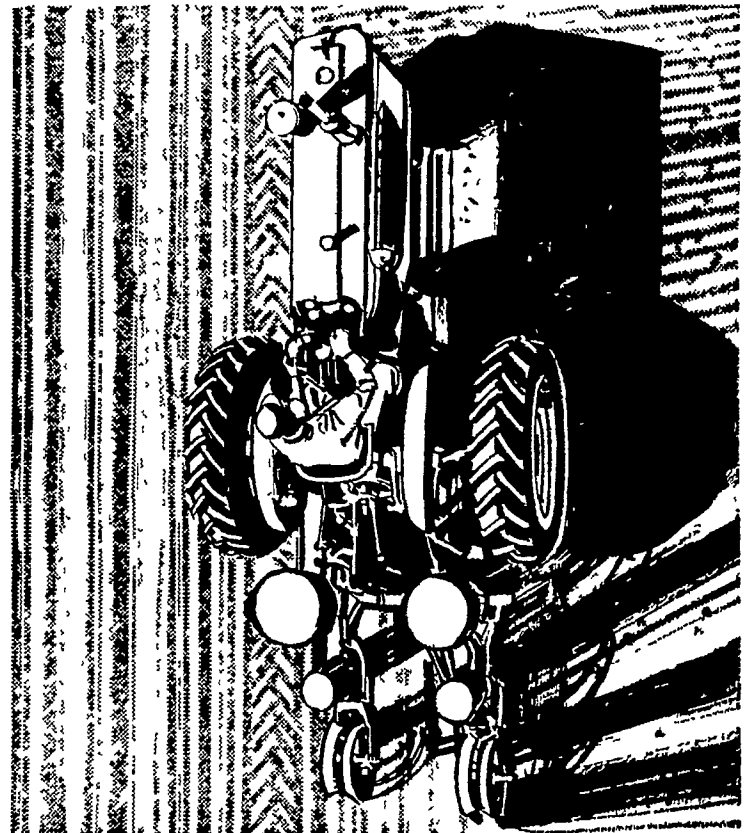

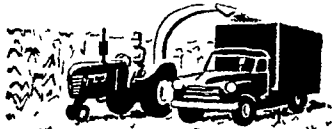
