Eastern Pennsylvania And New Jersey WEEKLY SUMMARY

LIVE HENS

Prices for light hens remained unchanged. Prices at high side of range reflect flocks subject to full condemnation deductions. Off farm movement light in N.J. and moderate in Pa. Processors received heavy volume shipments from points in New York State. There were too few sales to report prices on heavy hens. Offerings were limited in some instances, but freely made in others. Advices indicate weak market conditions being experienced for broiler chicks has caused some unsettledness. Demand light as buyers take a wait and see attitude immediately prior to religious holy day weekend. Prices paid at farm: Light hens 5-6 $\frac{3}{4}$, mostly 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ -6 $\frac{1}{2}$ c; Heavy hens, too few sales to report.
