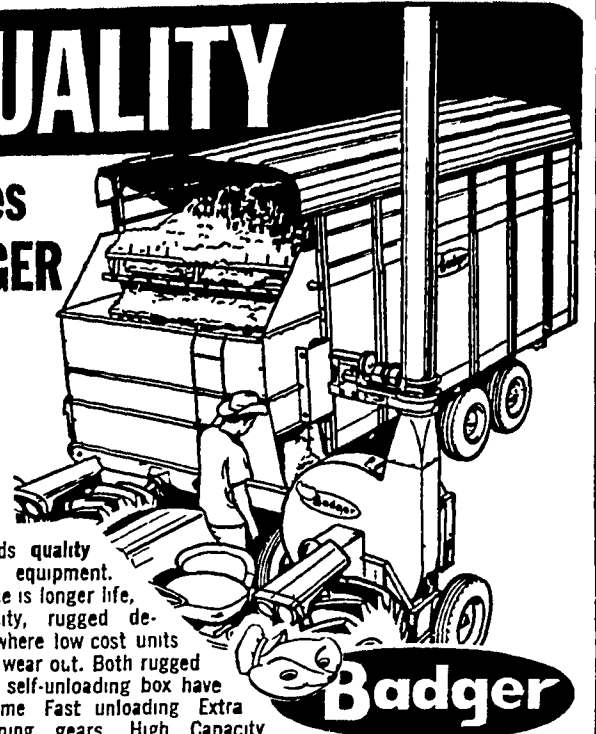

(Continued from Page 1) against hail damage. Other crops in most areas do not require such a high proportion of coverage.

The report reviews hail insurance for crops including volume of coverage, kinds of crops insured, and the percentage of harvest covered. It lists premiums and indemnities for 1965 and tabulates comparisons of coverage dating back some 30 years.

In all but three years since the 1930s the volume of crop-hail insurance has expanded, rising to a record high of \$3.1 billion in 1965. Coverage in 1965 was six percent above a year earlier, according to the report.

The Corn Belt accounted for more than half the coverage of all U.S. crop-hail insurance in 1965 because the severe though infrequent, hails in the region often cause heavy damage. The risk is high to both production and value of the corn crop, the report notes.
