CATTLE 3000 — Compared with last weeks close, slaughter steers mostly 50c higher; Cows steady to 50c higher; Bulls steady, instances 25c higher on Choice. The demand was centered on slaughter steers weighing over 1200 lbs. Feeder buyers competed on Good to low-Choice 950-1150 lb steers. Approximately 5 loads sold during the Wednesday auction. Supply included an estimated 65 percent slaughter steers, 20 percent cows and bulls with the balance mainly feeder steers.

Slaughter steers grading Choice and Prime made up about 75 percent of the steer supply. Cows mainly Cutter and Utility Holsteins.

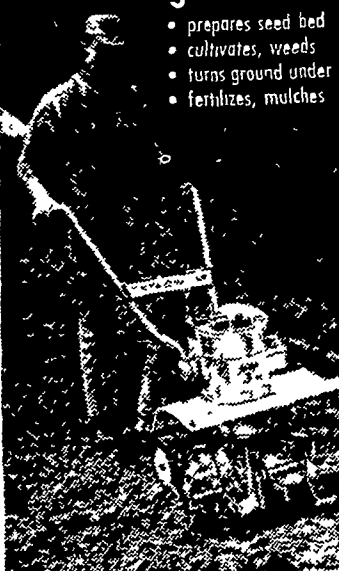
