WEEKLY SUMMARY

LIVE HENS

Prices on light hens were unchanged to 1/4c lower. Demand only fair. Local offerings barely adequate. Most plants supplementing supplies from outside areas in moderate volumes. Offerings on heavy hens ample for the light buying interest. Some inquiry for roasters over 7 lbs. remained unfilled due to limited open-market offerings. Prices paid at farm: Light Type hens 5-6 1/4, mostly 5-6c; Heavy 12 1/4-14c.

TURKEYS

Current offerings very light for fair to good buying interest. However, increased offerings noted for movement by the end of month. Some price negotiations developed for heavy hens for movement during week of May 27 centered at 22c per lb to be picked up at farms.






