Benny Kettering, Lititz R3, has joined the junior membership ranks of Holstein-Friesian Association of America. Nearly 13,900 youngsters are now actively enrolled in the breed organization's programs, the Association notes.

To qualify, member candidates must be under 21 years of age and have successfully completed one year's work in a 4-H or vocational agricul-

ture dairy project. Individual ownership of at least one registered Holstein is also required.

Junior members of the national association are entitled to all privileges except voting. They may register and transfer their animals at member rates and receive regular reports of breed and organization progress.

More than 43,500 young Holstein breeders have participated in the program since its start in 1923.

**EGGS PRODUCED, OFF 2%;  
PRICES 9c UNDER 1966**

**HARRISBURG**—The 287 million eggs produced in Pennsylvania in April were two percent less than last year's April production, Leland H. Bull, said this week.

Bull noted the average price received for all eggs sold during April was 33 cents a dozen. According to the State Crop Reporting Service, this was State Secretary of Agriculture, nine cents less than the April price a year ago.

**MILK YIELD AND COWS  
DECLINE EQUALLY IN PA.**

**HARRISBURG** — Cows on Pennsylvania farms produced 286,512,000 quarts of milk in April, Leland H. Bull, State Secretary of Agriculture, has reported. This is 6,976,800 fewer quarts than produced in April of last year, a 2.4 percent decrease.

Bull said the State Crop Reporting Service survey shows there were 746,000 milk cows in the state in April. This was a three percent drop from last April's milk cow numbers.

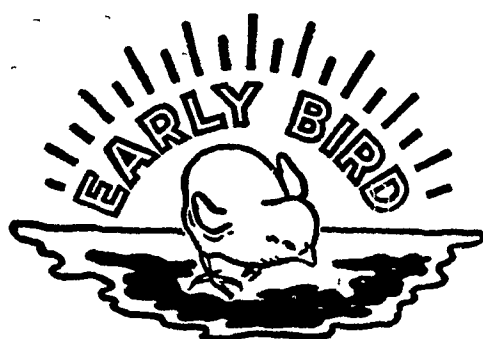
