WEEKLY SUMMARY LIVE HENS

Prices on light hens were unchanged to 1/2c lower. Demand fair. Offerings increased and were ample due in part to recent price break on shell eggs. However, some yearlings sold at 7c a pound, picked up at farms, for use in additional egg production. Heavy hen offerings were for the light buying activity. Prices paid at farm: Light Hens 5-6 1/4c, mostly 5-6c; Heavy Hens 11-13c.

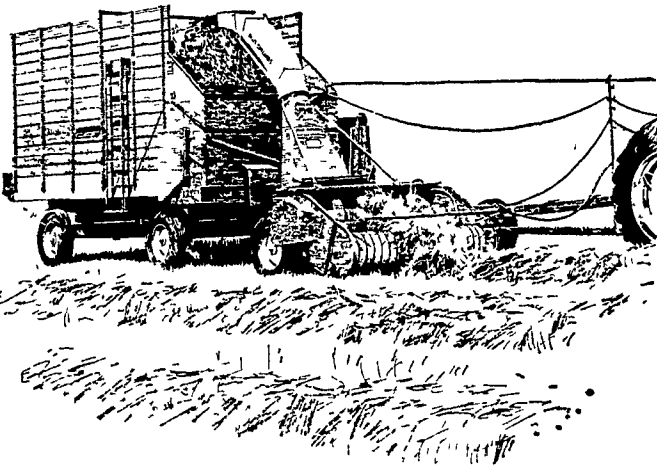
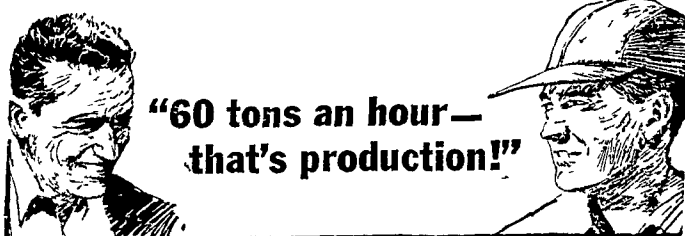
