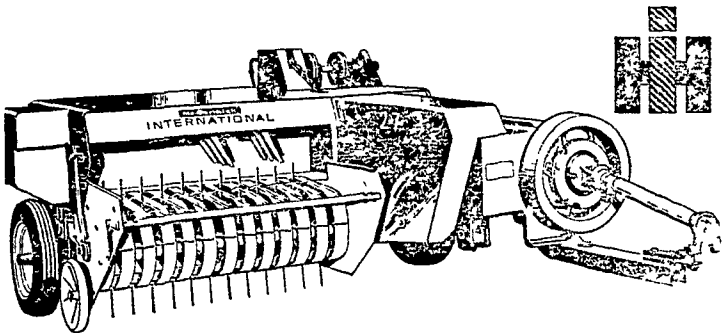

Dryness Halts Corn Planting—Area farmers following plows and planters were generally surrounded by dust clouds this week (May 17) as the dry spell extended into its third week.

Tomatoes, early peas, hay, and pastures are all retarded by the unseasonably dry weather.

Sec. Benson Seeks New Farm Legislation—Speaking at a spe-

cial news conference for the Newspaper Farm Editors Assn. in Washington, D. C. (May 12), agriculture secretary Ezra Taft Benson called for an agricultural act based on peacetime needs.

He indicated new farm legislation not based on needs of a general economic depression, or wartime, is needed.

The move has been toward less controls and regulations, Benson said. "I believe that present agricultural policies are sound," he added.

When questioned on specific changes he'd make, he said that for the present, he had none.

County Agent Gets Superior Service Award—Lancaster County agricultural agent M. M. Smith was presented a Superior Service Award Tuesday (May 21) at Washington D. C.

The award is one of the highest honors the U. S. Department of Agriculture can bestow.

Smith's citation read: "For superlative work in promotion of beef cattle feeding, and for outstanding leadership in 4-H Club achievements."

NEPPCO Survey Eyes Federal Controls—A survey of poultrymen conducted by

Northeastern Poultry Producers Council (NEPPCO) reveals it is the small poultryman who is most outspoken against federal crop planning or poultry production control.

Dr. Alfred Van Wagenen, NEPPCO managing director, reported that nearly 55 percent of those farmers with 20,000 hens, or more, indicated a preference for some type of federal help. Only about 15 percent of the growers with 1,000 birds, or less, thought government assistance a good thing.
