Crisscross, a nationally recognized bull with an EX-96 classification. Bobbi has been bred to the Excellent Glenafton Charmer, and is due to freshen in July.

The Royer consignment is Blossomelle Prince Charming, a young bull calf born August 6, 1966. Charming has the distinction of being the product of three of the all-time greatest A1 Proven Sires in history, Mrs. Royer notes. These include: his sire, Skokie Glamour Boy (EX-92); and grandsires, Burkgov Inka DeKal (EX-92), and Osborndale Ivanhoe (EX-90).

Charming's dam is Blossomelle Zsa Zsa (EX-90), a seven-year-old Ivanhoe daughter,

whose four completed lactations averaged more than 1000 pounds of butterfat. In her last 305-day lactation, Zsa Zsa had 25,671M and 1030F. Her lifetime total milk production exceeds 109,000 pounds. DHIR-3X.

The third county consignment is Martin's Spring Shade Wallie Ruth (VG-87), a five-year-old cow. Ruth was sired by Vista Grande Haven Wallie (EX and GM), a bull Martin recently sold to Tri-State

Breeders of Wisconsin. Ruth's latest lactation was 4-4 350d 15,610M 650F. Her dam, an 87-point Regal daughter, had a string of records to 19,000M and 710F. Her granddam was a Very Good Lucifer daughter.
