\$500 Kunzler Co. Scholarship To Chas. Patterson

Charles J. Patterson, Lampeter-Strasburg High School graduating senior, won his sec-

ond scholarship in as many weeks, Wednesday.

Patterson was presented with his latest grant at his high school's awards assembly by Christ Kunzler, president of Kunzler & Co., Inc., Lancaster. The grant, which amounts to \$500, brings Patterson's total scholarship earnings to \$800.

Patterson is the 18-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. Charles R. Patterson of Willow Street R2. He will attend Penn State University in the fall, majoring in agriculture. He was also one of six, \$300 Farm & Home Foundation scholarship winners, as reported last week.

As an active member of the Garden Spot Chapter Future Farmers of America, Patterson has served on various FFA committees, and has competed in judging at the Lampeter Fair for the past four years. According to his agriculture instructor Gerald Kiger, his academic record has been very good. Following college, Patterson hopes to go into conservation work for the government.

BEEF CONSUMPTION UP

Both production and consumption of beef could set new records in 1967, according to government and meat industry estimates. Forecasts are for an output of 19.7 billion pounds of beef, which is just about twice as much as was being produced by the cattle and beef industry 20 years ago. With that much beef being produced, Americans will be able to consume an average of 103.6 pounds per person, slightly above the previous record which was set last year. Twenty years ago per capita consumption of beef was around 60 pounds.

silage from small grain forage than from other silage crops. It often is best to utilize such forage in the form of pasture or green chop.

Oats, wheat and barley ensiled in the flower stage make the best feed. Rye, for reasons of palatability, should be ensiled when in the late boot to heading stage of growth. Small grains, like other grasses, make the best silage when ensiled at 70% moisture or less.


