Milk Order Legality Threatened - The complicated and confusing milk picture in Pennsylvania became ever more so this week (June 9) with the decision of the US Supreme Court in the case of two Pennsylvania milk processors.

By a vote of 6 to 1, the court upheld the claim of the two handlers selling milk in the New York-New Jersey area. It said the USDA had no right to require outsiders to pay money into a pool to be divided among farmers normally supplying milk to the area.

The decision of the court poses a threat to the entire structure of federal milk marketing orders since 31 of the nation's 83 milk marketing areas have similar regulations

The ruling involved an appeal by Suncrest Faims, Inc., Bethlehem, and the Lehigh Valley Cooperative Farmers. Inc., Allentown, both of whom sought not to make payments into the pool.
