CATTLE — Compared with last Friday Slaughter steers sold weak to 50 lower with a large share 25 lower. Slaughter heifers were steady to 25 lower, while cows were 25-50-lower. Bulls were fully steady. In the carlot dressed meat trade, steer beef was steady to 50 higher and heifer beef was steady to 25 higher. Cow beef sold generally 50 lower. Receipts 20,300, compared with 18,500 last week and 19,600 a year ago. Twelve market receipts 157,000 compared with 155,200 last week and 160,400 a year ago.
