U. of Pa. Gets Grant For Insect Study

A basic study of chemical compounds potentially useful for controlling pests through insect sterilization will be conducted under a \$24,892 grant awarded by the U.S. Department of Agriculture to the University of Pennsylvania.

The compounds to be studied are related to the chemosterilant tepa, which has been used extensively in research on chemically sterilizing the screw-worm fly, a destructive pest of livestock. ARS scientists will evaluate the biological activity of the compounds produced by the university study.

One of the problems in applying chemosterilants is that different insects are susceptible to different chemical agents. The Pennsylvania scientists will try to discover why this is so. Part of the study will be devoted to determining the relationship between the chemical structure and the potency of prospective sterilants.

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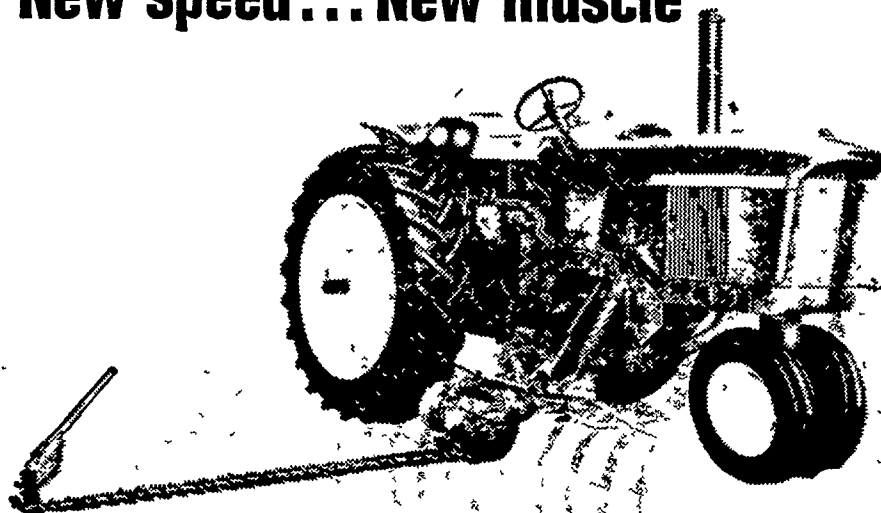
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
