WHEAT "TOUGH"

Not much local wheat had been brought to the elevators as of Friday morning, and early measurements showed a "tough" quality. Some wheat was reported received in the Quarryville area Wednesday by one elevator operator, and a few loads in the western part of the county were reported Thursday.

While a good No. 2 wheat should run 58 lbs to the bushel and no more than 13.5 percent moisture, one operator reported two, early local truckloads averaged about 57 pounds and 15.5 percent.

All grain, barley and wheat, coming to the elevators is being put through the driers, operators report.

P.A. BARLEY CROP GOOD

In the state as a whole, the

Service notes "Prospects bright for a banner barley crop" this year. PCFS reports yields of 80-90 bushels as "common".

Local reports are not quite as bright, however. One observer expressed some doubt about the quantity of barley raised this year: "I question whether there's as much barley around this year as people are saying; we haven't been getting it, and the season's nearly done." He added that a good part of the crop is probably being traded from farm to farm for feed.

Another operator said he had taken in as much barley this year as last, and estimated the crop was ample.
