need thermostatically controlled, dust and odor free heating to keep building temperatures at or above 50 degrees Fahrenheit. Electrical service should have a 240 volt, grounded system for loading ramps and for space and water heaters and tank compressors. Grounding for 120 volt electrical systems was often lacking.

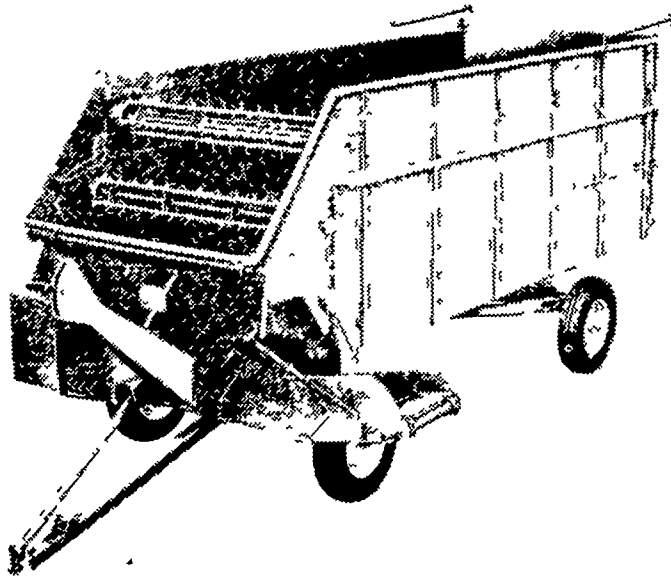
