CATTLE — Compared with last weeks close, slaughter steers and heifers sold 25-50 higher. Cows declined 25-50. Bulls were steady to 50 lower.

Local receipts 18,200, compared with 20,100 last week and 20,300 last year. Twelve market receipts 156,000 compared with 162,800 last week and 171,900 last year.

SLAUGHTER STEERS — Prime 1175-1400 lbs, mainly yield Grade 3 and 4 27-27.75, three loads 1250-1325 lbs at latter price on Wednesday. High Choice and Prime 950-1414 lbs, 26.50-27.25, with 950-1350 lbs, these grades yield Grade 3 and 4 and 1350-1414 lbs yield Grade 4 and 5. Choice 900-1350 lbs, 25.75-26.75. Mixed Good and Choice 900-1300 lbs 25.25-26, Good 24.25-25.25; Standard and Low Good 23.25-24.50.
