## RED MEAT PRODUCTION UP FOR 1ST SIX MONTHS

HARRISBURG — Red meat produced by Pennsylvania slaughtering establishments in the first six months of 1967 totaled 522 million pounds, seven percent more than last year's output for the same period, according to the Pennsylvania Crop Reporting Service.

June production of 83,691,000 pounds, although seven percent less than the previous month, was five percent more than for the same month a year ago. Pork output showed the largest increase in June, lamb and mutton were approximately the same, while beef and veal showed declines.

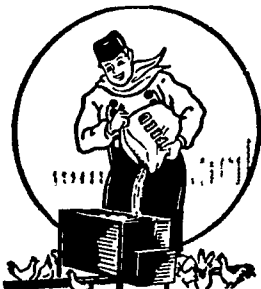

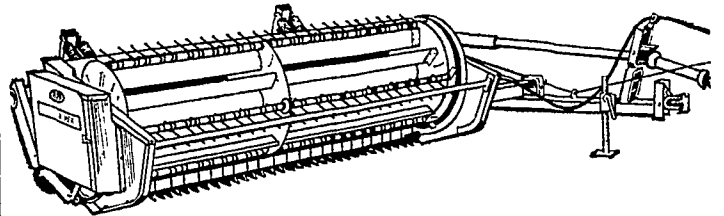
