 tions at six were found to be 'dirty pork bellies were being cured for bacon.' The plant is no longer operating. It burned down about three years ago.

"Also mentioned was a scrap-ple plant where the final product was being made with 85 percent cereal and water and only 15 percent meat'. Anyone familiar with Pennsylvania Dutch cooking will recognize this as a recipe for ponhaus that calls for the addition of corn-meal to meat and water 'until the mixture is the consistency of mush'.

"The report points out that eight plants under the state's voluntary meat inspection law were visited, and that conditions at six were found to be 'generally satisfactory'. There are 53 plants operating in the state under this plan.

"Animals are not inspected individually for diseases, the report claimed, and 'therefore, the public is not protected from the possibility of eating diseased meat'.

"I want to point out that Pennsylvania's animal health programs — from farm to meat counter — are thorough and efficient.

"We have worked hard for more than 30 years to wipe out tuberculosis and brucellosis in dairy and beef herds. Today, the incidence of these diseases is less than one-tenth of one percent. This is important to meat production since dairy animals, once they are no longer useful for milk production, are usually sold for making bologna, frankfurters and similar products.

"But all animals sold for slaughter at auctions and sales in Pennsylvania must be examined by veterinarians. Last year, 269 animals were condemned as unfit for human consumption. In this manner, Pennsylvania eliminates many potential trouble sources before animals reach slaughter plants," the secretary notes.

"Last year, 530,000 animals were slaughtered in plants operating under the Pennsylvania inspection program. Of this number, 539 animals were condemned."

Secretary Bull also called attention to a portion of the report that claimed there is "no control over the end meat products" under Pennsylvania's inspection law.

"This control comes under our general food laws and not under meat inspection," he pointed out. "Food agents of the Pennsylvania Agriculture Department regularly sample

food, including meat products, that are offered for sale in retail establishments. They buy these products, as any other customer would, then have them analyzed in our laboratories.

"Last year they detected 120 violations of laws pertaining to meat products and prosecuted the offenders. These involved the use of preservatives and cereals in ground meats, the addition of water to smoked hams, and the use of coloring in frankfurters and bolognas."

Secretary Bull said more manpower is needed to adequately enforce regulations, and that meat inspection laws "here

and in the United States need to be revamped.

"We favor mandatory meat inspection instead of the present voluntary program and recognize that a federal law is needed to provide for joint federal-state inspection. It also will require federal funds to match those provided by the state if full-time inspection of all meat and meat products is to become a reality," he concluded.

About 400,000 men and women throughout the 50 states volunteer as 4-H leaders and serve as project leaders.

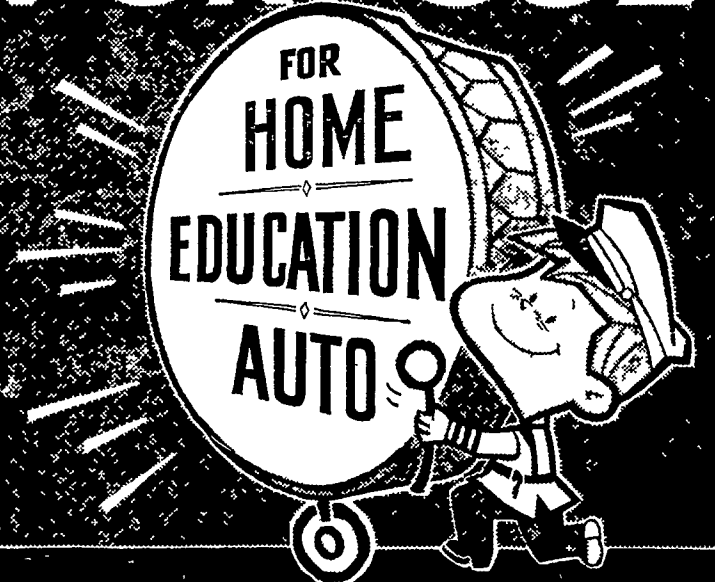
