LIVE HENS

Prices of light hens unchanged, however, in instances, buyers slightly less aggressive than past week as offerings increased due in part to sharp decline in egg market last week. Offerings of heavy hens adequate for fair buying interest with occasional small lots noted to local processors as high as 12-12½c. Prices paid at farm: Hens, Light 4-6, mostly 5-5½c; Heavy hens, 11-11½c.

TURKEYS

Ample offerings generally of a contractual nature, however, limited open market trading reported at 22-23c on young hens and 21c on young toms. Processors working at or near capacity in most quarters. Too few sales to report prices




