

County 4-H's Win Two Titles At State Days

Three Lancaster County youngsters brought back two state demonstration titles from this week's State 4-H Days at Penn State University. Lancaster's traditionally strong dairy and livestock judging teams, however, were defeated in close competition.

A first-place blue ribbon for demonstrations in the general category went to Averril Royer, 2025 Oregon Pike, for her "How to Give a Demonstration" performance.

In the general livestock category the team of Dale Bushong, Columbia R2, and Marvin Nissley, Mount Joy R1, captured first place with their demonstration on "Corn Is King".

A blue ribbon went to Hugh Wenger, Quarryville R2, for his third-place entomology demonstration "Mounting of

Adult Insects". Red ribbon winners were Ann Nissley, Mount Joy R1, and Audrey Yunginger, Marietta R1, for their demonstration "Protect Livestock — Use Pesticides Safely"; and Kaye Smith, Ephrata R2 for "A Pressing Need".

Still in contention for top state honors are two Keystone Award winners—Vicki Shank, Elizabethtown R1, in poultry, and Marguerita (Peggy) Eshelman, Pequea R1, in entomology. Their awards were based on activities scores. Each girl is ranked in the top three in the state in her category.

The senior livestock judging team, one of 27 entered placed third. Larry Herr, 840 Penn Grant Road, placed second as an individual, and Richard Buckwalter, Lititz R3, tied for fourth. Other team members are Lynn Heistand, Manheim R4; and Larry High, Leola.

Close scores indicated the stiff competition. Chester was first, with 1233 points; Adams, 1215; Lancaster, 1209; Somers-

et, 1207; York, 1206; and Dauphin, 1201.

The dairy team, one of 37, placed fourth. Wayne Yost, Narvon R2, ranked eighth. Other members are Carol Groff, Quarryville R3, John Kurtz, 1160 N. Market St., Elizabethtown, and Ann Lefever, Quarryville R1.

Blair County placed first, 1551 points; Bradford, 1537; Montgomery, 1530; and Lancaster, 1505. Following closely were Adams, Columbia, and Westmoreland Counties.
