

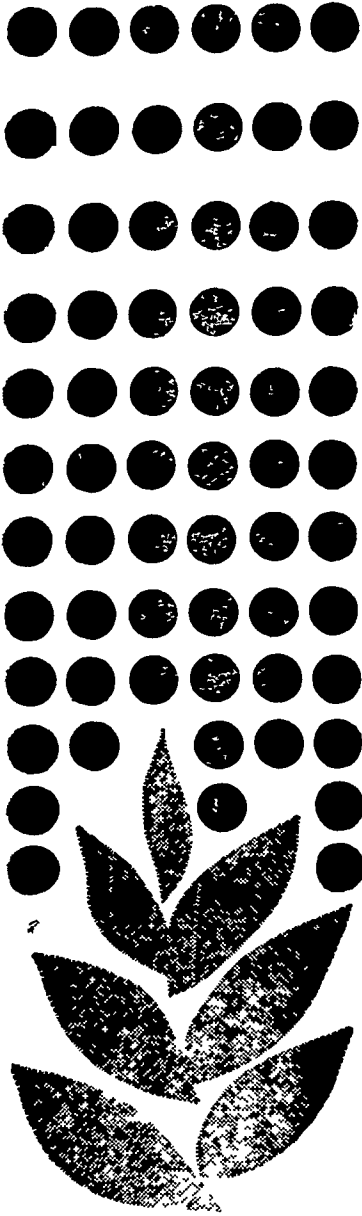

**Balmer Salvages Area FFA Dairy  
Efforts With District Guernsey Win**

**HERSHEY** - A 15-year-old Guernsey exhibitor kept Lancaster County from being completely shut-out of the champions' circle here Monday, at the Twelfth Annual Southeastern Pennsylvania FFA Dairy Show.

Jesse L. Balmer, a member of the Warwick Chapter, led his Gordline's S. H. Holly heifer to both the junior and the grand championship title in the Guernsey breed. Holly was first-place senior yearling. She was sired by Ideal's Patty's Superior and out of Dot's Honey.

The only other Guernsey entry from Lancaster was also

shown by Jesse, and was also first in her class. Gordline's Crowns Lulu was first senior calf for the Warwick FFA member.

The grand champion was favoring an injured leg all day, but the judge was satisfied the injury was only temporary and he did not discredit her.

In a much larger and better quality show than usual, Jacob L. Stoltzfus of the Pequea Valley FFA Chapter was the only local entry to stand first in class in the Holstein Show. Apple Stoltz Brook Supreme, a smooth-topped, white daughter

of Thornlea Texal Supreme out of Finets Fairview Admiral Girl was first in the three-and-four-year old class.

For the grand champion Holstein, Judge Howard Weiss, Myerstown R2, went to his junior champion and first place senior yearling. Florydale Tessie, a Penstate Star Man daughter out of Florydale General Tamie was shown by Richard Troutman Jr. Troutman is an 18-year-old member of the Conrad Weiser FFA in Berks County.

Senior and reserve grand champion was shown by Kenneth I. Sellers, Lebanon County. His two-year-old Gem Rock Flashy Fern was sired by Naches Hoogland Flash Boy. Kenneth is a member of the Little Dutchman Annville Cle-

ona Chapter.

Lebanon County had the first place county Group of Four. Lancaster was second followed by Berks, York and Chester.

Allen L. Groff, Lebanon County was the best fitter of the show and Richard Troutman, Jr., with his junior and grand champion took home the showmanship trophy.

In the Jersey show Edwin J. Teets, 15-year-old Dauphin County boy showed a Marlu Milad Model daughter to the junior and grand championships. She is a junior calf.

A senior calf — daughter of the same bull — was the reserve grand champion.

The senior and grand champion of the Ayrshire breed
