Slaughter heifers were uneven, weights over 900 lbs. were steady to strong, while kinds under 900 lbs. sold steady to weak. Cows declined 25-75, while bulls sold steady to weak. 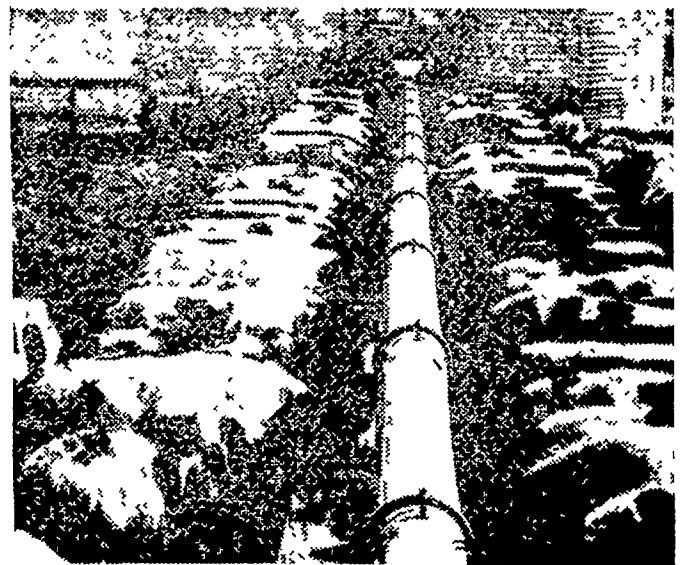
