NEBA Sire Tops All U. S. Holsteins

Whirlwind Kingpin, in service at Northeastern Breeders Association, (NEBA) Tunkhannock, Pa. tops all U.S. Holstein sires according to the latest Department of Agricul-

ture Sire Summary.

He stands out as the highest plus proven A.I. sire for milk in the United States. Dated June 1967 this USDA release shows a Predicted Difference of +1,497 lbs. of milk and +53 lbs. of fat for Kingpin daughters over their herd-mates, with 866 daughters in 361 herds. His highest producing daughter is Shade Rock Mary Fobes Kingpin bred by Earl Hoover of Mifflintown, Pa. now owned by S. R. Hansel of Houtdale, Pa. Her record at 2 yrs. 3 months 2x in 308 days, 24,511 lbs. of milk, 919 lbs. of fat on DHIA.

Leading official Holstein-Friesian Association of America record for Pa. 2 year olds is 2 yr. 3 mo. 2X, 305 days, 21,200 lbs. of milk and 719 lbs. of fat for Penn Dell Kingpin Cindy, another Kingpin daughter, owned by Allen Dairy, Mechanicsburg, Pa. and bred by Jay L. Houser of Spring Mills, Pa.

Kingpin was purchased in 1959 at the dispersal of the Whirlwind Hill Farm herd, Wallingford, Connecticut. His buyer was the First Pa. Breeding Association of Lewisburg, Pa. Later, in 1964 when First Pa. merged with other A.I. Co-ops to form NEBA, Kingpin moved to the headquarters of the new Co-op at Tunkhannock, Pa.

Sired by Winterthur Apollo, Excellent, Gold Medal, Kingpin's dam is Osborndale Gay Fobes, Very Good, a maternal sister to Osborndale Ivanhoe, Excellent, Gold Medal. Still going strong, this grand cow was recently purchased by T. Robert Williams of Uniondale, Pa., at the recent dispersal of the Green East herd, Valley Falls, New York.

In addition to Kingpin's outstanding record of siring production, he has distinguished himself with a remarkable record of semen production. Dur-

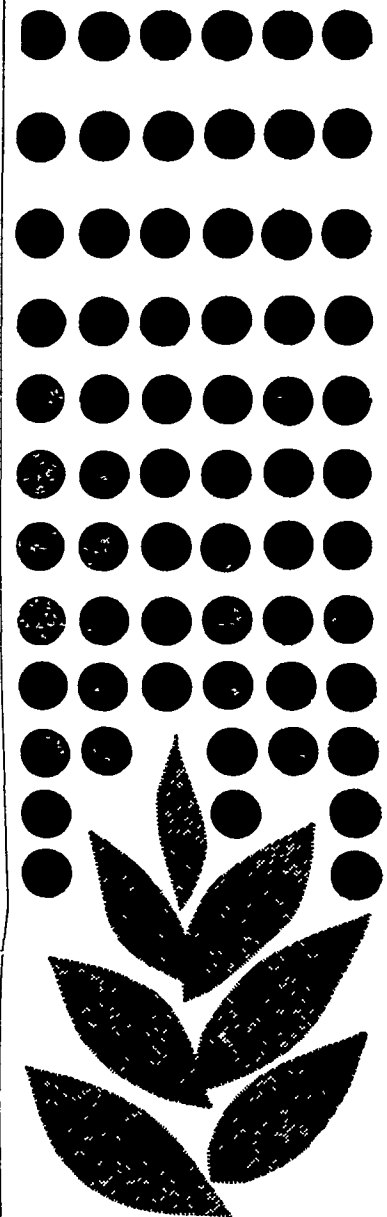
ing 1966 he bred more than 50,000 first service cows, all through frozen semen.
