solids the farmers are giving away at low prices to make competing products that have captured 15 percent of the fluid milk market in a 90-day period. The fat on which the milk price and testing programs are based is being ignored.

The estimated cost of the new program to farmers is 35 cents per cow, approximately the same as present costs. However, the generally strong opinion of the local board was that the cost would be higher. Concern was also raised that the local unit would lose all authority.

Secretary Allen Risser expressed the apparent thinking of the group when he said, "I don't think we should rush in."

In other business, Jacob Houser Jr., treasurer, reported a year-to-date margin as of July 31 of \$1516.79. The directors expressed concern that accounts receivable was still

\$1,011.62, but Houser said the new rule, whereby the tester must collect the testing fee before receiving his salary, did not go into effect until Aug. 1 and was not reflected in the report. "It should improve from now on," he said.

The directors voted to buy four new milk-o-meters, and plastic covers for all other association-owned meters. The association is reimbursed for the meters by a 4-cent per cow charge to the farmers using them.

Also the allowance for testers going to the state and district conferences was increased. If the tester goes to the two-day state conference he will now receive twenty-five dollars instead of ten, and the district participant will receive fifteen instead of seven dollars. It was noted, in giving this increase, the tester not only has trip, lodging and meeting expenses, he loses his wages for the days he is away.

Daniel Stoltzfus presided at the meeting.

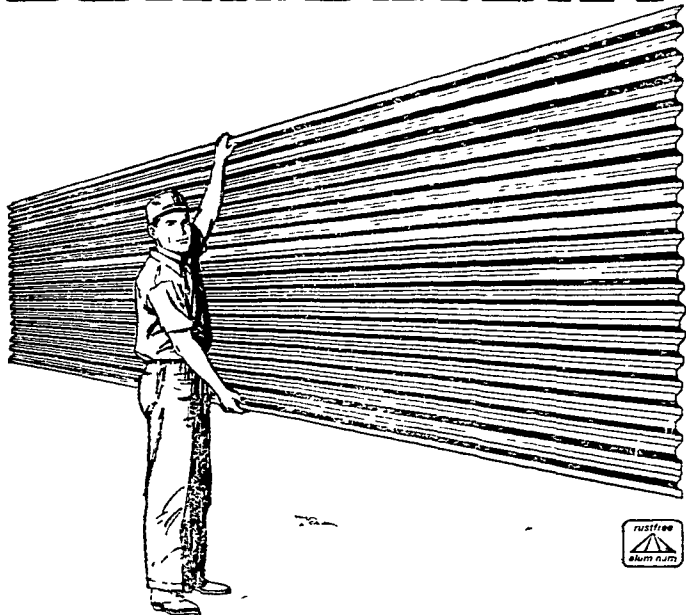
ment jargon is the number one for up to four complete production cycles. "non-irrigated" farm county in the nation, and poultry is its leading agricultural enterprise.
