He explained that Pennsylvania, like other states, is becoming increasingly interested in export trade. "We are going to have to go out and sell our products more than we have in the past," Secretary Bull added. Representing the Agriculture Department will be Jack R. Grey, deputy secretary; Will Ketner, director of the Bureau of Markets, and John W. Early, agricultural planning, evaluation and research director. In addition to Pennsylvania, 11 other states will be exhibiting food and agricultural products. Following the Munich event, Pennsylvania products will be shown in England in the Hall (Continued on Page 21)

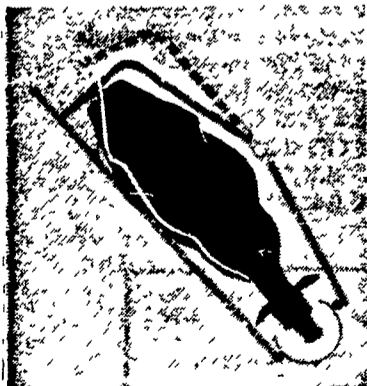

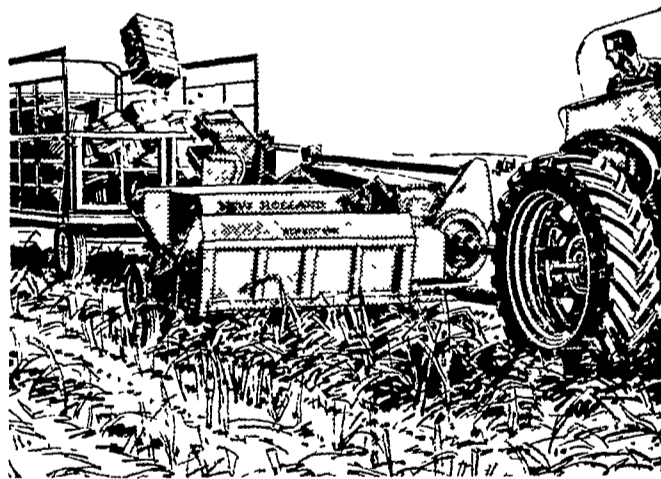
