Caring for Iron Cooking Utensil

You need to season an iron cooking utensil when it's new for rust resistance — unless it is labeled "pretreated."

First scour utensil with household cleanser on a sponge or cloth — never use steel wool on iron.

Then wash thoroughly in hot soap or detergent suds, rinse with hot water, and wipe dry immediately.

Spread melted vegetable shortening or unsalted vegetable oil over the entire inside of the utensil and its cover using a pastry brush or paper towel.

Heat the utensil for two or three hours in a 250 degree oven or over low heat on top of the range.

Supervised Credit Activities Aid 3.2 Million People

Supervised credit activities of the Farmers Home Administration aided more than 3.2 million rural people during fiscal 1967, Secretary of Agriculture Orville L. Freeman announced today.

This total marked a new high and a 30 percent increase over the number benefited in fiscal 1966.

USDA's Farmers Home Administration advanced a total of \$1,390,000,000 to borrowers

in fiscal 1967, of which \$822 million was provided by private lenders whose loans were insured by FIIA. Direct loan funds were provided primarily by collections on previously made loans.

Repayment of principal and interest set a record for volume in fiscal 1967 — \$657.6 million, up 7 percent over the previous year. Loans outstanding on June 30, 1967, totaled \$3.6 billion.

"Farmers Home Administration plays a key role in the Department of Agriculture's major effort to help improve the quality of life in rural America," the Secretary said.

Those benefiting from the agency's services in fiscal 1967 included 355,000 farm and rural families receiving loans during the year or using credit advanced in prior years. Also included were 400,000 families forming rural groups using Farmers Home Administration credit.

Mr. Freeman cited these examples of benefits which resulted in fiscal 1967 from Farmers Home Administration programs.

—More than 1,000,000 rural residents will be served by the 1,112 community water or sewer systems being built or improved with \$175.1 million in loans and \$22.5 million in grants.

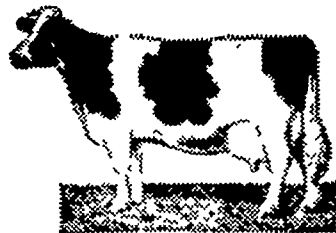
