

Weekly Poultry Report

Eastern Pennsylvania And New Jersey Weekly Review

Prices of light hens held unchanged. Heavy type while generally unchanged did range higher on small lots in instances. Demand on light type fair but unaggressive. Offerings barely adequate in New Jersey but adequate from other areas. Demand for heavy type fair to good with interest for part loads often unfilled. Prices paid at farm: Light Type Hens 4-6, mostly 5½-6c; Heavy type 11-12, mostly 11c.

TURKEYS

Contractual movement continues heavy as processors generally working at as near capacity as possible. Labor shortages generally the limiting factor to full production. Open market demand generally light. Offerings fully adequate; however, in instances, interest in medium weight white hens reported unfilled. Sales too limited to report prices.

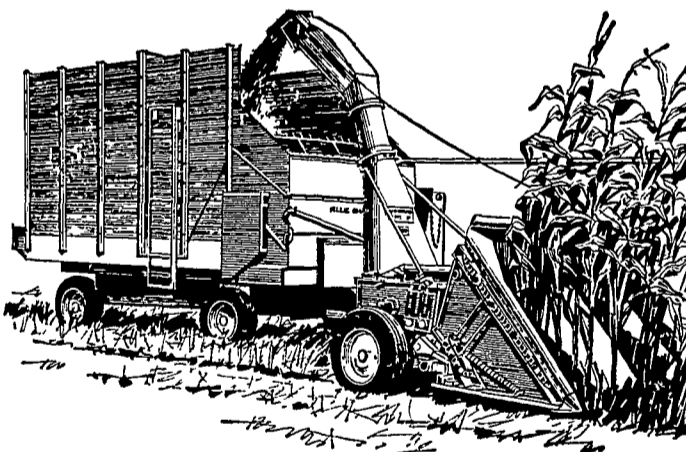
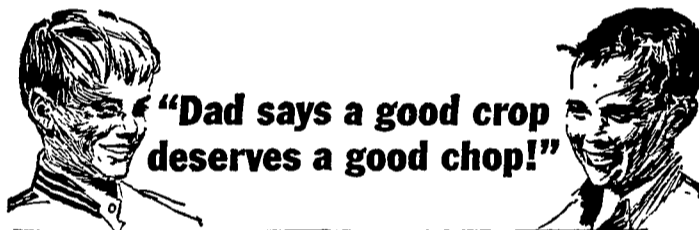

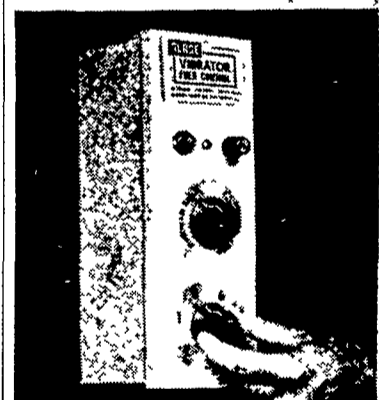
