

Lancaster Co. To Be Visited By Poultry Tour

A planned bus tour of the biggest poultry attractions in America's top agricultural county is fast becoming a caravan.

What was originally planned as a busload of interested producers out of a view of Lancaster County's most talked about egg and poultry operations has now overflowed into two busloads, according to Richard I. Ammon, executive director of the sponsoring Northeastern Poultry Producers Council.

The tour is being held in conjunction with the three-day annual NEPPCO Exposition in Harrisburg's huge Farm Show Building on October 10-11-12. It is slated to take place on Monday, October 9, just prior to the show.

"We'll continue to take reservations on a first-come, first-served basis," Ammon said. A limit of four buses will be set, he added.

The tour, planned and coordinated by the Lancaster County Poultry Association, will visit a 240,000-layer complex, a giant egg and poultry processing plant, a broiler operation growing out 300,000 birds each year and a broiler hatchery.

And it will also include lunch, a visit to the renown Pennsylvania Farm Museum and an authentic Pennsylvania Dutch feast at the famous Plain and Fancy Farm Restaurant in Intercourse, Pa.

The tour begins and ends at the Farm Show Building. Advance registration is required. The cost is \$10.00 per person and includes transportation, meals and admission to the NEPPCO Exposition. Reservation requests together with payment should be directed to NEPPCO, 10 Rutgers Place, Trenton, New Jersey, marked "Lancaster County Tour".

The NEPPCO Exposition is highlighting speakers on a broad range of up-to-the-minute poultry health, management and marketing topics, educational displays, youth activities and scores of commercial exhibits featuring the latest in poultry equipment, products and services.
