served. These 16 plots are 3 to 5 acres in size. Approximately 250 different varieties of commercial corn hybrids have also been planted by corn seed companies.

Two other types of demonstration plots have been established under high fertility conditions. One section, for grain, was planted at 24,000 plants per acre in 20, 30, and

40 inch rows.

Another section, for silage, was planted at 28,000 plants per acre in 30 and 40 inch twin rows. Also, 4 acres of row fertilizer demonstration plots may be compared.

Corn Field Days are sponsored by the Pennsylvania Crop Improvement Association and the Cooperative Extension Service, in cooperation with numerous commercial agricultural companies.

The Sunday Farm is located one mile north of U. S. 11 near New Kingston.

## Baler Attachment Color Marks Bales For Identification

A baler attachment that marks hay or straw bales for easy identification has just been patented by New Holland Division of Sperry Rand Corporation. The device sprays colored liquid on the wire twists that hold bales together. It was invented to stop pilferage, especially where big-scale growers leave hundreds of tons stacked by the roadsides.

The attachment is designed to fit right on the bale chamber and doesn't interfere with normal baler operation. It can apply up to three different colors, making possible a large number of combinations. There's no danger to livestock, because the marking colors are completely edible.

Branded bales would scare away most highwaymen. But even if they are stolen, bales are readily identified because each grower can select his own distinctive color code.

New Holland's marketing plans for the baler brander attachment are still incomplete.
