Eastern Pennsylvania And New Jersey Weekly Review

Hens
Prices of both light and heavy type hens unchanged; however, in instances, slightly higher bids were reported on heavy type in effort to secure needs. In instances, colored hens reported moving in a range of 8-9c. Offerings of light type noted increasing in New Jersey while about steady from other areas. Demand improved slightly in some quarters. Offerings of heavy type fully adequate overall; however, in instances, held with confidence. Prices paid at farm: Light Type Hens 4-6 mostly 5½-6c. Heavy Type Hens 11-12c.

Turkeys
Demand improved slightly in some quarters from smaller processors as they book needs for ice pack fresh supplies for approaching Hebrew holiday period in early October. Offerings ample for needs with sales reported within a wide range of 22½-25c on hens and 20½-23c on toms due in part to size of sale and labor involved in loading. Movement under contractual agreements continues heavy and limited only by availability of labor for processing. Sales too limited to report price.

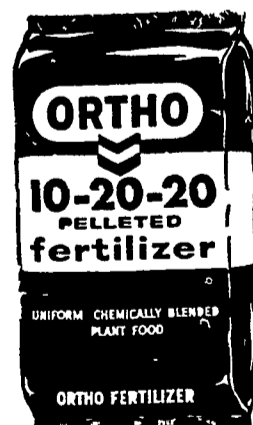

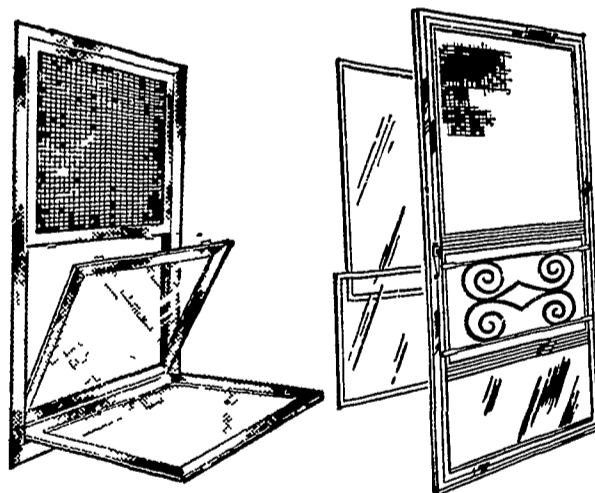
