

Martin Attends Two Day Milk Conference

Daniel L. Martin, director of Inter-State Milk Producers' Cooperative, and fieldmen, Charles E. Cowan and Andrew Marvin, attended a two-day conference in Philadelphia. They studied the current milk marketing situation affecting federal and state orders.

Conference activities included possible solutions to milk pricing problems, and a complete review of various types of marketing programs in operation today.

Dr. James E. Honan, general manager of Inter-State, moderated the program for the directors and fieldmen on federal orders, cooperative mergers and federations, and Class I pricing.

Dr. Paul E. Hand, economist for Inter-State, and A. Evans Kephart, Inter-State counsel, discussed cooperative laws, and dairy imports, milk pricing and milk quality control were included in the two-day sessions, in relation to the demand for the product and the exodus of today's farmers from the agricultural scene.

Golden W. Davis, management assistant, reported on problems surrounding milk procurement in the four-state market area.

Fieldmen from four states reported on milk marketing problems as they exist today in their respective areas.

F. Bennett Carter, president of Inter-State, presided over the two-day conference.

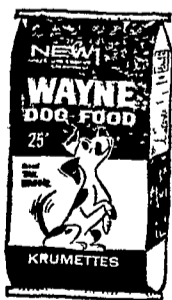

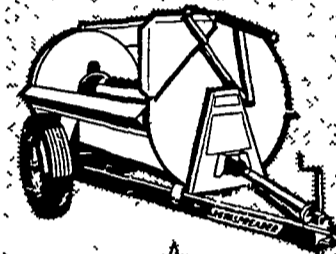

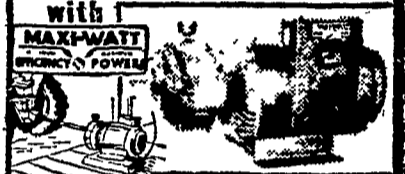
