

ASC Community Committees Newly Elected

Results of election of ASC Community Committeemen for the year starting October 1st were announced this week by Fred G. Seldomridge, Chairman, Lancaster County Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Committee. The elections were held by mail and ballots were tabulated publicly by the incumbent ASC County Committee.

The ASC Community Committee chairman, vice chairman and regular member automatically becomes delegates to the county convention where

farmers are elected to fill vacancies on the ASC County Committee. The alternate committeemen become alternate delegates to the convention.

The County Convention was scheduled to be held last evening at 7:30 p.m. in the Lancaster County ASCS Office, 1466 Manheim Pike, Lancaster, Pa. Delegates will elect one County Committee member for a 3-year term and two alternate members for a 1-year term. After the county committeemen are elected, the delegates will determine which of the three regular members will serve as chairman and vice-chairman for the coming year.

Present Committee includes Fred G. Seldomridge, Chairman; Elmer L. Huber, vice-chairman; and John J. Herr,

Regular Member. Mr. Seldomridge has completed his second year of a 3-year term, Mr. Huber, his first year of a 3-year term, and Mr. Herr, his last year of a 3-year term.

ASC County and Community Committeemen are in charge of local administration of farm-action programs such as the Agricultural Conservation Program, Cropland Adjustment Program, Feed Grain and Wheat Programs, acreage allotments, Wool Program, price support loans and farm storage facility loans.

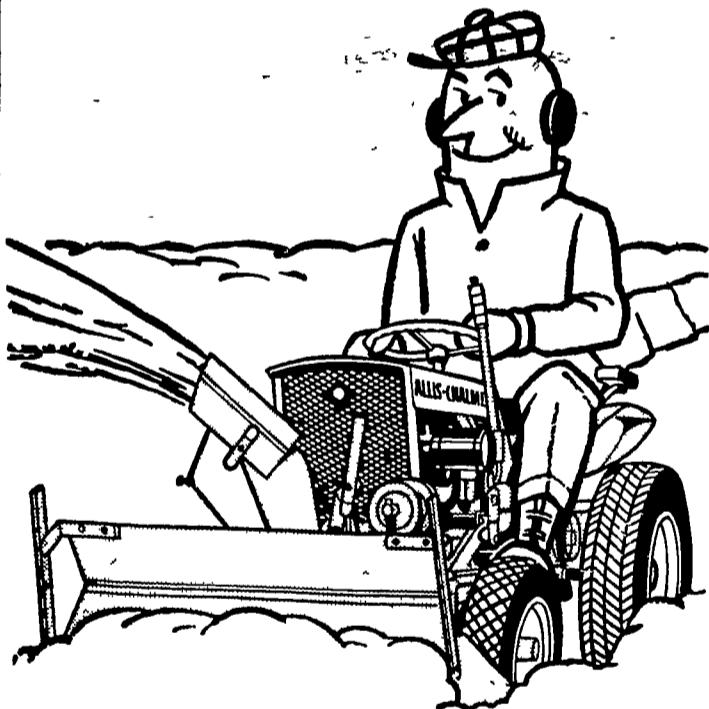

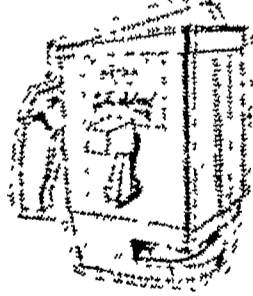
