Use hot water for colorfast cottons and for synthetic fiber yarns

Use warm water for wools, and extra soap or detergent because wool absorbs more suds than other fibers.

If bleaching is necessary, use the type bleach recommended for nylon

Most stretch garments can be dried in an automatic dryer. Select the temperature proper for the fibers.

If touchup ironing is needed, press lightly under a damp cloth. Set the iron temperature at nylon or cool, or use a steam iron.

You can thoroughly dry stretch slipcovers before replacing them on furniture because the stretch fabric assures a smooth, snug fit without damp-shaping
